








Activities to help your child at home with French:



Research some recipes from France and cook them together at home. Write /draw a review together, to describe what you thought of the dish.	Make maps together of cities in France-can you add famous landmarks to the map?
When you are going up and down the stairs, practise counting in French.	Greet family and friends in French by saying 'bonjour' and say goodbye with 'au revoir.'
Visit the farm and see if you can name the animals in French.	Visit a local travel agency and pick up a brochure about France. See what facts you can find out.
Watch a film/tv programme in French, with the English subtitles on. Listen out for any key vocabulary that you recognise from French lessons in school.	Write a letter to a friend in French. You could use a French dictionary or Google Translate to help with words that you do not know.
Research a French Festival and see if you can re-create it at home.	Video call a family member or a friend-challenge yourself to have as much of the conversation as you can in French.
Make your own snap card game. You could use names of animals, colours, numbers etc. Remember to make 2 of each card, so you can play snap!	Try to identify colours in nature— point out colours and name them in French.
