## MINDFULNESS

### Spring Listening Moment

Sit quietly in your garden for a few moments. Listen to all the different sounds you can hear. Can you hear the wind or the birds? Talk quietly with a grown up about what you heard.

## ARTS AND CRAFTS

Make a handprint Easter card. If you don't have paint, you can draw around your hand and colour it in or cut it out of paper. Post a photo of your card on Class Dojo to say a "High Five" and Happy Easter to all your Nursery friends.



If you prefer, make an Easter bonnet or hat. Strike a pose and post a picture on Class Dojo of you wearing your hat. Big smiles please!

## NATURE ACTIVITIES

Can you find natural materials to make an Easter egg picture? Take a photo of your egg.



## SING-A-LONG

Have a karaoke sing-a-long with your family. There are lots of Easter songs for Early Years children on the internet or you could just sing your favourite song for one another to join in.

## BE PHYSICAL

Hard boil some eggs. Try having an egg and spoon race with a member of your family or an egg and spoon relay race if you have enough people for teams. If you don't have eggs, find a small object you can balance on a spoon. You could also try an egg rolling competition to see who can roll an egg (or ball) the furthest. You could measure each distance the egg/ball is rolled using paces or giant strides so you are practising counting and measuring too.

## PLAY OUTSIDE

Play a game of Easter Bunny bowling. Make an Easter Bunny using an old box. Practise your rolling, aiming and counting skills by seeing who can get the most balls into the Bunny's mouth. Good luck!



## READ

### Easter Name Hunt

Ask a grown up to write the letters of your name on pieces of paper or card. Then ask the grown up to hide the letters around your home or garden and tell you how many letters you need to find. When you have found all the letters, can you put them in order to read your name?
